If the superintendent does not recommend a person, that person's name is not listed on the agenda and there is no vote on that action. If it is necessary for the Board to go into executive session at the end of the meeting, we will provide an estimated length of time for the session and whether any action is anticipated to be taken upon returning to public session.

Ms. Hudock, the Principal of William Annin Middle School, and Ms. Howarth, a teacher from William Annin Middle School, provided a presentation that described the criteria and application process for the Schools to Watch program. This recognition has only been given to several hundred middle schools nationwide and two schools in New Jersey this year.

Ms. Hudock and Ms. Howarth presented the results of the self-study, described some of the best practices used at William Annin Middle School and provided a description of what this recognition will mean for the school moving forward.

President Wooldridge stated that there was a change in the agenda with the removal of Finance item #10 noting that there was no authorization for Mission One to advertise employment positions and encouraged public comment.

Superintendent Markarian noted that when the removed Finance item #10 was placed on the agenda it was not intended to give the Board of Education the ability to outsource aide positions and that an attempt was made following the publication of the index to clarify this to the district staff. Mr. Markarian explained that the intent of Finance item #10 was to have the option to economically hire aides this spring when additional, unbudgeted aides were needed for special needs students entering the district mid-school year.

#### **IX. Public Comment on Agenda Items**

President Wooldridge opened Public Comment on Agenda Items by noting that there would be a 30 minute session limiting each speaker to three minutes.

Public comments centered on the concern of using outsourced aides in the schools. Comments included the need for aides for special needs students and the close, trusting relationships that these students have with their aides, concerns regarding high turnover of these aides and negative effects on the students and staff, safety concerns and also stories of special needs students whose growth and success, in part, has been made possible by the aides that assist them.

Exhibit A

Refunding Bond Ordinance of the Board of Education of the Township of Bernards in the county of Somerset, New Jersey, providing for the refunding of all or a portion of its outstanding refunding school bonds, Series 2006, dated December 8, 2006, issued in the original principal amount of \$10,000 and authorizing the issuance of not to exceed \$10,150,000 aggregate principal amount of refunding school bonds to effect such refunding

WHEREAS, on December 8, 2006, The Board of Education of the Township of Bernards in the County of Somerset, New Jersey (the “Board” when referring to the governing body and the “School District” when referring to the territorial boundaries governed by the Board) issued \$10,000,000 aggregate principal amount of tax-exempt Refunding School Bonds, Series 2006, dated December 8, 2006 (the “2006 Refunding School Bonds”); and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the current tax-exempt interest rate environment may enable it to realize going-forward debt service savings for property taxpayers residing in the School District through the issuance by the Board of Refunding School Bonds (the “Refunding School Bonds”) to refund all or a portion of the \$9,830,000 aggregate principal amount of the outstanding 2006 Refunding School Bonds maturing on or after July 15, 2017 (the “Refunded Bonds”); and

WHEREAS, in efforts to realize such taxpayer savings, the Board now desires to adopt and enact a refunding school bond ordinance (the “Refunding Bond Ordinance”) authorizing the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$10,150,000, the net proceeds of which shall be used to refund all or a portion of the Refunded Bonds in accordance with their terms.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BERNARDS IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** The Board is hereby authorized to refund all or a portion of the \$9,830,000 aggregate principal amount of outstanding 2006 Refunding School Bonds maturing on or after July 15, 2017. The Refunded Bonds may be redeemed on and after July 15, 2016 at a redemption price equal to par, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.

**Section 2.** In order to finance the cost of the purpose set forth in Section 1 hereof, the Board is hereby authorized to issue not to exceed \$10,150,000 aggregate principal amount of Refunding School Bonds, all in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61 through 62.

**Section 3.** An aggregate amount not exceeding \$150,000 may be allocated from the aggregate principal amount of the Refunding School Bonds to pay for the aggregate costs of issuance for the Refunded Bonds, including, but not limited to, bond insurance premiums, underwriting fees, official statement printing fees, public advertisement expenses, refunding verification agent fees, refunding escrow agent fees, bond counsel fees and other expenses in connection therewith.

**Section 4.** The purpose of the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds is to realize net present value interest cost savings for property taxpayers residing in the School District (“net” meaning savings after payment of all costs of issuance of the Refunding School Bonds). Applicable State requirements mandate that such net present value interest cost savings equal at least 3% of the principal amount of the Refunded Bonds. In addition, the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds shall comply with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 5:30-2.5, including that within 10 days of the date of the closing on the Refunding School Bonds, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary shall file a report with the Local Finance Board within the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs setting forth (a) a comparison of the



Refunding School Bonds’ debt service and the Refunded Bonds’ debt service, which comparison shall set forth the present value savings achieved by the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds; (b) a summary of the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds; (c) an itemized accounting of all costs of issuance in connection with the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds; and (d) a certification of the Business Administrator/Board Secretary that (i) all of the conditions of Section (b) of N.J.A.C. 5:30-2.5 have been met, and (ii) a resolution authorizing the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds, adopted pursuant to 18A:24-61.5(b), was approved by a two-thirds vote of the full membership of the Board.

**Section 5.** The Supplemental Debt Statement required by N.J.S.A. 18A:24-16 and N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61.4 has been duly prepared and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Township of Bernards, in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey (the “Township”) and in the Office of the Business Administrator/Board Secretary as of the date of approval of this Refunding Bond Ordinance, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, and such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Township is increased by \$320,000 as a result of the authorization of the Refunding School Bonds.

**Section 6.** The Board covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under Section 103(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, of the interest on all Refunding School Bonds issued under this Refunding Bond Ordinance.

**Section 7.** This Refunding Bond Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption hereof.

The Board also noted that the Ridge Cabaret performance led by Barbara Retzko was incredible and they were extremely impressed with the talent displayed by the students.
