There are times when a member of the public makes a comment or asks a question about an employee. New Jersey statute does not permit us to discuss personnel issues in public. Also as a matter of law, a Board of Education may only vote for or against the hiring of an employee upon the recommendation of the superintendent. If the superintendent does not recommend a person, that person's name is not listed on the agenda and there is no vote on that action.

If it is necessary for the Board to go into executive session at the end of the meeting, we will provide an estimated length of time for the session and whether any action is anticipated to be taken upon returning to public session.

#### VII. Student Representative - Lucas Miller

Lucas Miller, Student Representative, reported that the Homecoming weekend was a huge success with the Homecoming Dance held on October 1, 2016 and the tailgate the following day. #### VIII. Superintendent's Report

#### BE IT RESOLVED THAT

1) Title I Update - Jean O'Connell and Lisa Vitale-Stanzione

Lisa Vitale-Stanzione, Supervisor of Special Education, discussed her work with the Superintendent, Nick Markarian, Principals and Assistant Principals of the District to determine what the district is doing well, what it can improve on, strategies, to improve diagnostic testing and intervention strategies. She also provided an update to the status of the Title I funds that the district is set to receive that will be used for Professional Development, Materials and Manipulatives for the Special Services Department.

The Bernards Township Board of Education does hereby approve Kayla 2) **D'Ambrosio** to conduct a research project in conjunction with graduate work at Montclair State University for the 2016-17 school year.

Kayla D'Ambrosio, a 2010 Ridge High Graduate that is working on her Graduate Degree in Industrial Psychology, presented a research project to the Board of Education in which she would be surveying the parents and staff of the District to determine how leadership styles impact organizational citizenship. Questions from Board members included what measurement tools would be used, the sample size, the method in which Ms. D'Ambrosio would be reaching out to parents and staff and the scope of the evaluations.

3) The Bernards Township Board of Education does hereby approve a research project on school refusal with **Dr. Brian Chu** of Rutgers University, Department of Clinical Psychology for the 2016-17 school year.

Dr. Brian Chu proposed a research project to the Board Members that the District would participate in called The Rutgers School Avoidance Early Detection Program. The program is an ongoing collaboration that through research hopes to determine what children are at risk for school avoidance and provide the tools for early intervention. Board members discussed the dynamics of school refusal and asked questions regarding the determination of participants and privacy matters.
