CURRICULUM

Chairperson Bev Cwerner reported on the September 17 committee meeting including final recommendation for establishing grades 6-12 lab standards, the program evaluation report for science grades 6-8, review of Earth Science textbook for adoption (grade 8), change in course titles, preliminary testing report data, the guidance software allowing for electronic transmittal of documents to colleges and the possibility of an Option 2 program to ease student transition to an 8-period day at the high school.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Board members asked questions regarding the SEE program, crosswalk at Ridge High School and air conditioning timeframe at Liberty Corner School.

X. Board Forum

- 1) 2010-11 Board Goals
 - Maintain and update a budget model which enables a thorough analysis of the school district’s priorities in light of changes in funding levels and mandates. Prior to determining the final budget, review other high achieving, low cost school districts for cost saving practices and determine if Bernards Township

School District should adopt similar practices to ensure that the highest priority is given to student achievement.

- Address drug and alcohol prevention programs, with a focus on the grades 6-12 problems, with the goal of recommending changes and/or improvements as appropriate to address problem of underage drinking and illegal drug use.
- Increase public participation and awareness without incurring large costs.

Put board meetings on public access channel if cost negligible.
Determine board philosophy on current issues and pending legislation in order to communicate effectively with public and local and state elected officials.

Increase community access to the details of the school budget by making copies of the budget available in the public library, including more detail in budget presentations, and putting more budgetary information online if the cost is negligible.

Ms. Cwerner began the discussion by reading draft 2 of the goals with the inclusion of a statement in Goal 3 on public availability of school budget details. The Board discussed the possibility of adding a fourth goal on presentations as a way for the Board to have a more in depth review various of program areas and district performance in general. It was decided that topics for presentations would be forwarded to Ms. Carlsson prior to the board's October meeting.
